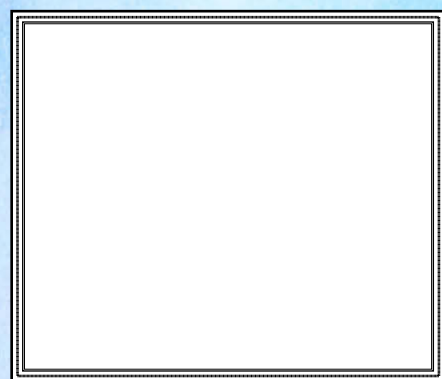

The Sir Frederick Gibberd watercolour collection is always on show, it's a permanent display. All of the paintings were given to Harlow in 1984. They came from Sir Gibberd and Lady Gibberd's very own personal collection, they'd been collecting the paintings for over 40 years.

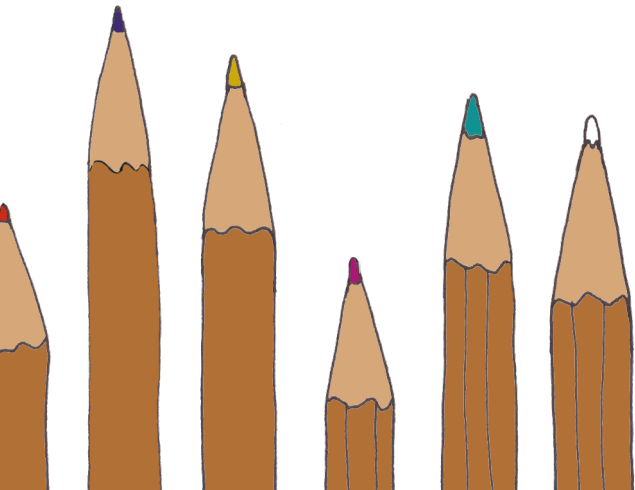
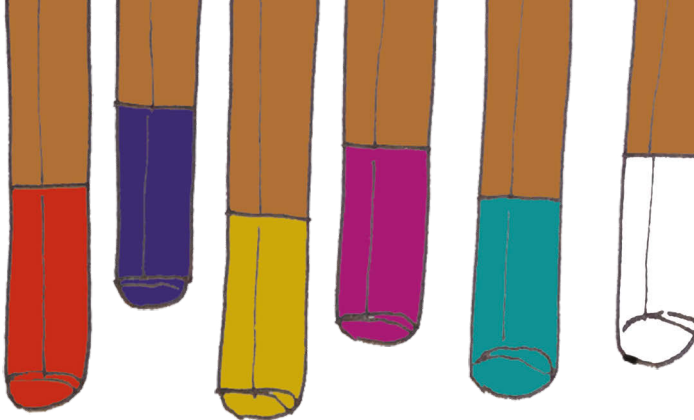
